This year fire activity is already up 45% over last year and the expectation is that fire season will be much worse than last year. As you know, last year when Northern CA was struck by large wild fires, volunteer groups did what they could for the animals affected. However, one of the largest issues faced, was at many of the evacuation centers, animals were not accepted. As a result, a number of pets and other animals were lost, a number of those perished.

In Tehama County, if disaster strikes, P.E.T.S. will be a major resource for the public. In anticipation of the worst-case scenario, we are beginning to prepare. Therefore, we are asking in advance if you can assist in any way. Your help could potentially benefit many people and their animals in many ways!

Be prepared this fire season is our motto! Therefore, please find enclosed Animal Preparedness sheets for both small and large animals and a listing of safety zones, which may prove beneficial, should you have to evacuate your own home.
